The book of Acts tells the story of what God has done in the life, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus as the early followers of “the way” have their lives reoriented by the Spirit. Paul was on his own way, when the risen Jesus appeared to him. After this encounter, Paul recharted his course from a persecutor to a proponent of Jesus.

This would not be the only time his plans are upended, however. A man from Macedonia appeared to Paul in the dream pleading with him for help. In response, Paul changes direction and heads to Phillipi. Here he meets Lydia, a woman of faith and financial means who supports his ministry extending hospitality. A new community is formed, and their relationship and support of Paul continue as he returns to his travels.

Along the way, Paul finds himself in prison. While there, he writes to the people he knows at Phillipi in a letter that we know as Philippians. The circumstances were difficult, bleak, and yet Paul abounds in joy, felicity, and thanksgiving for what God has done in Jesus and for the ways this news shapes how the Philippians live.

Church reformer, Martin Luther introduces the letter like this:

“In this epistle St. Paul praises and admonishes the Philippians that they abide and carry on in the true faith and increase in love. But since injury is always done to faith by false apostles and teachers of works, he warns them against these men and points out to them many different preachers—some good, some bad—including even himself and his disciples, Timothy and Epaphroditus. This he does in chapters 1 and 2.

In chapter 3 he rejects that human righteousness not based on faith, which is taught and held by the false apostles. He offers himself as an example: he had lived gloriously in this kind of righteousness, and yet now holds it to be nothing, for the sake of the righteousness of Christ. For human righteousness makes the belly its god, and makes men enemies of the cross of Christ.

In chapter 4 he exhorts them to peace and good outward conduct toward each other, and thanks them for the gift they sent him.”

How might this letter function among us? Although there is a lot of bleakness in our global and local circumstances, perhaps we can be prompted to thanksgiving, joy, and felicity even amid circumstances beyond our control.

To that end: Thank You!

Thank you for supporting our roof replacement. We can gather for worship and host events without worry of mold or water damage.

Thank you for the energy and support shown to our renewed effort organize our gifts of time and talent.

Thank you choir, cantors, lectors, instrumentalists, greeters, ushers, tech booth volunteers. Thank you Worship Team for planning and thoughtful ideas.

I am thankful for the opportunity to celebrate the recent Baptisms of Lucas and Carson, Affirm the Baptisms of Riley and Lillian.

These are just a few ways I see the letter of Philippians at work among us. **How about you?** For what are you thankful? What brings you joy? How do you see Jesus at work? Drop me an e-mail and let me know!

Mission Circle School Kits. We are in need of donations of school supplies to fill backpack school kits to send to Lutheran World Relief for children who are living in poverty:

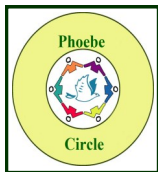
- 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 ½"; no loose leaf paper

- Pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- Box of 16 crayons
- 2 ½" eraser

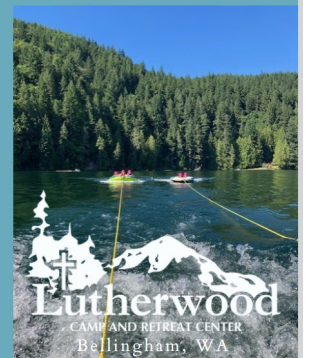

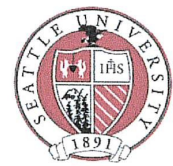

June 2026 *From the June edition of The Spirit*

From the Bishop:

What is the Bible? Some say the Bible is a book that dropped down from heaven completely written. Some say the Bible is nothing but a bunch of stories from long ago that don't matter. Neither of these are accurate. Instead, what we as Lutherans believe, is that the Bible is a sacred and holy book because through its 66 books – the stories, poems, history, laments, letters, and more – the Bible points us toward Jesus. Jesus, the One who reveals God's grace, mercy, justice, and love for the world.

As Lutherans, we understand that the center of the Bible is always Jesus. Martin Luther famously said that when we read scripture, we should ask, "Does it show Christ?" In other words, does this verse or passage reveal God made known in Jesus? Does it move us toward peace, wholeness, reconciliation, forgiveness, and love? Or is it being twisted to justify oppression, cruelty, and exclusion? Luther believed that faithful people do not simply quote isolated verses. We are to wrestle with scripture honestly and faithfully always through the lens of Jesus.

Luther also insisted that scripture must interpret scripture. No single verse stands alone. Every verse and passage and book is meant to be in conversation with the broader arc of scripture – with the prophets, the gospels, the letters, and, especially, with the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. This means we read the Bible seriously, but not literally. We pay attention to context, history, genre, and the larger witness of God's love. When a verse seems to pull us toward harm or violence, we are called to read the passage again, asking whether the interpretation is consistent with God as revealed in Jesus.

I chose to write on how to read the Bible because, quite frankly, what the bible is and biblical interpretation matters deeply right now. I see scripture being selectively quoted by people in power to dehumanize and scapegoat vulnerable communities, glorify wealth and power, and distort sacred texts into slogans. Verses are being lifted out of context while the broader witness of Jesus' life is ignored.

Earlier this year, I watched a recruitment video for the U.S. Department of Homeland Security that opened with helicopters flying overhead and the words from Matthew 5:9 on the screen: Blessed are the peacemakers. What followed were images of heavily armed men in tactical gear carrying weapons, breaking down doors, and carrying out violent raids against immigrants. I could not help but notice how far this imagery stands from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, the very place from which that verse is taken.

On the eve of the 250th anniversary of this country, I pray that we would reject the misuse of scripture and instead read scripture faithfully so that we might follow Jesus more closely. I pray that we would acknowledge our own complicity, resist the temptation towards power or fear, care for those who are vulnerable, and stand up and speak out truthfully and prophetically.

Let us return to the prophets who call for justice and care for the poor. Let us return to the Sermon on the Mount where Jesus blesses the meek, the merciful, and the peacemakers. Let us return to the cross, where God rejected violence and domination as the final word. Let us rejoice in the resurrection, where hope, mercy, and love rise again even in the midst of fear and despair. Let us read scripture faithfully and let us follow Jesus.
